She can also be seen in the United Kingdom on her primetime television hit Help Me Rhonda.

Iyanla Vanzant - Iyanla Vanzant rose from a troubled and abusive childhood to become an inspirational teacher, celebrated columnist for Essence magazine and the best-selling author of books such as Acts of Faith and In the Meantime. Founder of the Inner Visions Spiritual Life Maintenance Center, Vanzant leads extremely popular personal growth and motivational workshops all over the U.S.

JOSIE (21) Chicago, IL: Fans of STARTING OVER will remember Josie as the woman who arrived late in season one, due to give birth in a matter of weeks. With no resources and grim prospects, Josie struggled with the decision to keep her baby or give it up for adoption. As season one came to a close, Josie had given birth to Chloe, a beautiful and healthy baby girl. Early in the new season, viewers will see the resolution of this dramatic storyline.

TOWANDA (30) Atlanta, GA: Towanda struggles under the expectations of her prominent show business family.

Over 3,000 women auditioned for the second season of STARTING OVER at casting calls held nationwide, and via videotaped submissions. After numerous auditions, five women (in addition to Josie) were selected as the season two initial cast. Each woman is expected to reside in the STARTING OVER house for six to twelve weeks, depending on the scope of her "project" and her rate of progress toward her goal.

LOS ANGELES (Hollywood Reporter) - There's no shortage of American women who want a second chance in life,

The NBC Enterprises project, featuring a group of women who each have a compelling reason to start their lives over, will be the first so-called "alternative reality" show to go out in first-run syndication. Production is due to begin in June.

Casting is under way in 10 cities nationwide, with women of all ages and from all walks of life looking to join the show. The Philadelphia casting call attracted about 600 women.

Those who make the cut will live together in a house in Chicago as they pursue their various goals. For those who succeed, it will mean graduation from the house and "a new life." For those who fail, it will mean the heartbreak of returning to their former lives. As each woman leaves the house, a new woman will replace her.

NBC Enterprises senior vp Linda Finnell, who is working with series producer Bunim-Murray Prods. ("The Real World"), said the applicants' stories are "compelling."
