Since organizing isn't my forte... I wouldn't mind professional services... But it just seemed that based on what I read at the chat that Amy really wanted to be true to herself... Seems this show is creating a bonanza for them... Big difference between when the show first came on and they were struggling to make ends meet and now..

If noone is familiar with the show... It's a reality show that follows a very special family who lives in Washington State.. The parents are little people, who have 4 children. 3 of normal sized with the 2 eldest being twin boys... One small in stature like his parents and the other normal.

What I find endearing about this family, is that how typical the kids are... in interacting with one another and with their parents and then again how much you really do see that they love each other and are trying to raise the kids with good values. Sure there are things that I wouldn't do... but I see so many good things in this show.

It's also nice to observe the issues related to being a little person.. and perhaps being a normal person with little parents! They all take everything in stride..and the love and caring is very apparent!

I don't think I could subject my kids to this stuff (as far as if I were in their shoes and the invasion of their daily lives with the cameras)... They want the farm to become self supporting and I have no doubt their beautiful farm has rec'd free exposure and should be a popular spot now!

I adore Matt. Remember that romantic candlelight dinner he took Amy on last season? He was telling her how much he loved and appreciated her and all she could do is criticize him. It seems that she does that most of the time. The man's legs are so deteriorated that he can barely walk, but she nagged and nagged until he went back to to his sales job which requires traveling around the world. I can't believe this is good for his health.

I know she says she had two jobs, but, last season when she was describing what she did, she said she was an assistant pre-school teacher and she didn't work everyday. Her other job was coaching her son's soccer team. I think they were 8 year olds. It wasn't as if she was working 2 full time jobs for many hours per week. THis new episode showed her at the pre-school graduation as if she was THE teacher. I don't recall it that way from last season. Looks like extreme editing to me.

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Last season I also recall Matt sending Amy and their daughter on a hot air balloon ride, taking Amy on a cruise to the Caribbean, remodeling their house to make the kitchen more accessible for Amy and buying her a new car with a remote hatchback to make it easier for her to use. He is a thoughtful man.

This season's first show after Matt read aloud the poem written by one of their son's, Amy says sarcastically, that he read it badly. Matt apologizes and sits there looking shamed....for nothing. She is just mean. This was before he gave her the organizer as a gift so she couldn't use that as an excuse.

I think a nicer mother's day gift would have been flowers, jewelry, or such, but she would just criticize whatever he chose.

As far as the house goes, it is a sight, but, I don't judge people based on how tidy their house is. My standards are high, but I know some great people who live in a mess. I don't blame Amy for that.

There is really no excuse for their house to be so disorganized though. Three of those children are old enough to keep it very clean as a part of their chores. When I was growing up a part of my job in the family was to clean most of the house. I didn't like it, but, we did have a clean and tidy home. I think the show is doing a great job exposing what little people are like. I know I now feel comfortable with them and would welcome them into my social circle without hesitation. Amy is the one who does the day to day managing of the house and kids.. Before the kitchen was remodeled, just making meals and normal stuff was definitely more labor intensive because of her own stature.. The new kitchen I am sure is alot more user friendly for her... Last night Jeremy was complaining about the height of the microwave... In a house like that you can't please everyone... Heck, microwaves are so cheap... why not have 2!

I see Amy coming around this season.. I think she's beginning to enjoy the perks that the show has bought to the family and it should ease the financial problems.. Matt seems to want to spend money on one project or another faster than he can make it... I think it was probably alot more reassuring to have a steady paycheck.. I think he'd be able to have a home office and work for home rather than doing the travel... I thought it was ultimately her decision..and made to ease her stress.. He was just trying to get the farm profitable..

I think Amy entered the whole idea of the TLC project with skepticism.... What mother wouldn't have? To her it was probably another 'dream'... I really gotta respect her for wanting to be who she is...warts and all..(i.e. messiness). You can see the genuine love the family has for one another... She is the disciplinarian of the family... and he gets to play the good guy to the kids the majority of the time.

One episode last season I disagreed with Matt was about the money that Zach mishandled from the farm sales... Matt had it and was waiting for Zach to panic or realize it was missing.. Apparently it came out that everytime Matt found money of Zach's or something he put it away... He said he'd eventually give it back... I just think they should have been in agreement with how it should be handled.. I agree about teaching the kids responsibility...But Matt was a bit gleeful about not letting Zach know what he was doing... I don't remember exactly how it went down.. Oh yeah, Zach was part of the chat... It was an interesting read.

He's a smart businessman... I'm sure Amy is thanking and appreciating him... I do see alot of warmth... But keeping up with 4 kids is a crazy life. I can imagine the day to day craziness.

Last night they showed the preschool graduation and it looked like Amy was the spokesman to the families... so I think

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she was or wound up anyway being the primary teacher..

I hardly ever see her sitting down... so I think she is an incredibly hard worker and devoted mom. I can see why Matt really does genuinely appreciate her too!

I recall seeing something a couple years ago about a dwarf orthopedic surgeon but I don't recall anything about his family.

One of the episodes this past season on the Roloff family, is that Matt took Zach to meet several professionals who happened to be dwarfs.. One was able to capitalize on his size and did special work on submarines... another was a professor..

What sets the Roloff family apart is the diversity of the family sizewise and how they deal with that... Also interesting that they live on a beautiful farm and both parents came from average sized parents.

There are a couple dwarfs in my neighborhood. I know one woman by her first name and she lives a half block away... She tends to be a bit shy... Her husband is average sized and her 2 children are also dwarfs.. One is a sophomore in high school. I sure hope kids that are different due to dwarfism are benefitting from this show...and making 'normal' kids a bit more sensitive and accepting. The other woman I've seen only occasionally in the grocery store.. Yes, that is definitely a challenge! I have often seen Patti, shop later at night when the store is less crowded.. I'm sure you get sick of people looking at you differently.. I appreciate how Amy and Matt just accept and ignore the idiots...

I felt bad for Matt when he had to go through the extra security search at the airport.

I also wondered about all the extras! Matt did say that he had alot of miles piled up due to his traveling for his job.. But that looked like a 5 star hotel! The surfing and snorkeling looked fun but I kept thinking of all the wild life specials I have seen about shark attacks on swimmers and surfers in Hawaii. I'm serious. At one time they had a offensive kill program in Hawaii to kill certain sharks because of the fatal attacks on swimmers. It didn't work and messed up the ecosystem so they ceased the program. I'm not a spoil sport, really, but sharks and helicopters are not my favorite things. I used to swim all the time at the beaches here in North Carolina and South Carolina, but we have had our fair share of shark attacks too....even some deaths. I would have liked it if they had shown how they spent some down time in the hotel.. Do they play board games or watch a video? The whole vacation they were go...go...go... The zip wire activity looked pretty affordable especially if you booked it online.. I wonder how long it would have taken to do it.. I'm sure they may have provided it in exchange for the plug on the show.. I mean that's how I found the site. BTW, that link I gave had some graphics that were pretty neat. I need to look through it more..but thought you'd like it..

Debby, I've NEVER had a manicure or pedicure. No desire to have a pedicure ever! Something about other people handling my feet would 'ick' me out.. Maybe because I wouldn't want to handle other people's feet! I haven't ever fussed too much with my nails. Especially not the last 20 years or so..

With Matt and Amy living on a farm..I didn't get the impression it was something she did on a regular basis.. Maybe a special occasion only. Everyone there is Vietminese.(sp?) They have a very strong work ethic and love to please the customer. You sit in these chairs like you saw on the show and they are vibrating, so you have this wonderful relaxing massage as you sit and have the soapy whirlpool on your feet. They then trim and file your nails, do other work on your toes, and remove dead skin from your feet. They don't judge feet. They treat every foot like a piece of art. I am witness to this.

I lay my head back and almost go to sleep. Sometimes it tickles a bit. They then massage your feet under the water and then dry them off, apply lotion or oil and massage your calves ankles and feet. She should address that to Matt himself and outside of the ears of the kids.. They should present a united front.. especially with kid issues and discipline issues..
